

Lessons Available: PreK-5TH grade

Seed Surprises: Students discover seeds come in a variety of sizes, shapes and colors, as well as produce plants.

Fruits and Veggies: Students identify and compare fruits and veggies through a fast-paced game and taste test.

Let's Celebrate! Students explore the role of celebrations in their own lives and in the lives of others and the important foods involved in those celebrations, with a focus on corn.

Seasons through the year: To build awareness of seasonal change, students use their own birth dates, a comparison of seasons in different settings, and self-made books.

We're into pumpkins: Through hands on, interdisciplinary activities, students learn about pumpkins as fruits and as food sources.

Buzzy, buzzy bee: Students play a game in which they pretend to be honeybees and apple trees. In the process, they learn about plant pollination.

Gala Fiesta Jamboree: Students explore the role of celebrations in diverse cultures, their class and local community.

Oh-the Trees: Through the eyes of The Lorax, students learn how important trees are in our environment.

Does your Corn Pop? Students learn about corn, how it's grown, and a variety of ways humans and animals enjoy it.

We live on a farm: Students learn about farming, why farmers farm and where our food comes from.

Loco for Cocoa: Students learn how chocolate is produced from cacao, where cacao is grown today and taste the different types of chocolate we have today.

EnviroScape: Demonstrates how storm water runoff carries pollutants through the watershed to a pond, lake, river, bay or ocean-and the best management practices to prevent this type of pollution from occurring.

Goods from the Woods: Through research and advances in technology, we have learned to convert tree fibers and paper-pulping residues into a wealth of products. Students will discover how important trees are through hands on product identification.
