



**MOORE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

**TUESDAY, MARCH 5, 2019**

**REGULAR MEETING, 10:30 A.M.**

The Moore County Board of Commissioners convened for a regular meeting at 10:30am, Tuesday, March 5, 2019, in the Commissioners' Meeting Room on the second floor of the Historic Courthouse in Carthage, North Carolina.

**Commissioners Present:**

Chairman Frank Quis, Vice Chairman Catherine Graham, Jerry Daeke, Louis Gregory, Otis Ritter

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Chairman Quis called the meeting to order at 10:30am. Reverend William Saunders of Pleasant Hill United Methodist Church offered the invocation and GIS Manager Rachel Patterson led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD**

There were no speakers.

Chairman Quis asked if any commissioner had a conflict of interest concerning agenda items the Board would address in the meeting and none was stated.

**CONSENT AGENDA**

Upon motion made by Commissioner Graham, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to approve the following consent agenda items:

## **PRESENTATIONS**

### Sandhills Center Quarterly Report

Caroline Xiong, Finance Director, presented the quarterly fiscal report for Sandhills Center for Mental Health/Developmental Disabilities/Substance Abuse Services. Commissioner Graham inquired regarding the report of expenditures in excess of revenues and Chairman Quis asked how they compared to the previous year. Ms. Xiong and County Manager Wayne Vest explained that Sandhills Center's fund balance had built up and the State encouraged them to spend it down, thus provided funding accordingly.

## **QUASI-JUDICIAL HEARINGS**

### Call to Quasi-Judicial Hearing/Planning – Conditional Use Permit Request: Tourist Home, 148 Rice Road, Vass

Debra Ensminger, Planning/Transportation Director, requested the Board call a quasi-judicial hearing regarding a Conditional Use Permit request. Upon motion made by Commissioner Graham, seconded by Commissioner Gregory, the Board voted 5-0 to call a quasi-judicial hearing on March 19, 2019 at 5:30pm for a Conditional Use Permit for a tourist home to be located at 148 Rice Road, Vass.

## **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

### Call to Public Hearing/Planning – Conditional Rezoning Request: Rural Agricultural RA to Neighborhood Business Conditional Zoning B-1-CZ, 1504 North Moore Road, Robbins

Debra Ensminger, Planning/Transportation Director, requested the Board call a public hearing regarding a conditional rezoning request. Upon motion made by Commissioner Daeke, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to call for a public hearing on March 19, 2019 at 5:30pm for a conditional rezoning from Rural Agricultural (RA) to Neighborhood Business Conditional Zoning (B-1-CZ) for a building addition to North Moore High School, for an auxiliary gym, classrooms, and bathrooms, of an approximate 48.93 acre parcel, located at 1504 North Moore Road, Robbins.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

### Public Works – Request for Approval of Contract for Purchase of Five Vehicles

Randy Gould, Public Works Director, requested the Board's approval of a contract for purchase of five compact trucks for his department. Commissioner Graham noted that the County had followed required purchasing laws, but she was disappointed that the vendor selected was not from Moore County. Mr. Gould explained that local vendors had been contacted to provide bids but the responsive ones did not offer the lowest cost. Commissioner Gregory asked what would be done with older vehicles and Mr. Gould and County Manager Wayne Vest explained that they would be sold as surplus and the funds in this case would be returned to the general fund, though in some cases it would return to the enterprise fund, depending upon which fund from which the vehicles were originally purchased. Upon motion made by Commissioner Graham, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to authorize the Chairman to sign a contract with Fred Anderson Nissan in the total amount of \$126,565 for the purchase of five compact trucks.

## **APPOINTMENTS**

### Board of Health

Upon motion made by Commissioner Gregory, seconded by Commissioner Graham, the Board voted 5-0 to reappoint William Mang to the pharmacist position on the Board of Health for a three-year term expiring March 31, 2022.

### Juvenile Crime Prevention Council

Upon motion made by Commissioner Graham, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to reappoint Laura May to the Schools representative position on the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council for a two-year term expiring March 31, 2021.

### Library Board of Trustees

Upon motion made by Commissioner Daeke, seconded by Commissioner Graham, the Board voted 5-0 to reappoint Rose Highland-Sharpe to the Library Board of Trustees for a three-year term expiring March 31, 2022.

### Local Emergency Planning Committee

Upon motion made by Commissioner Ritter, seconded by Commissioner Daeke, the Board voted 5-0 to reappoint Cynthia Bradley to the Local Emergency Planning Committee for a three-year term expiring March 31, 2022.

### Nursing and Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee

Upon motion made by Commissioner Ritter, seconded by Commissioner Graham, the Board voted 5-0 to appoint Franklyn Howatt to the Nursing and Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee for an initial one-year term expiring March 31, 2020.

### Animal Cruelty Investigator

Upon motion made by Commissioner Daeke, seconded by Commissioner Graham, the Board voted 5-0 to reappoint Dr. Tony Ioppolo as the Moore County Animal Cruelty Investigator for a one-year term expiring March 31, 2020.

## **COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS**

Chairman Quis reviewed that in October, the Board had received a presentation from Maria Campbell with Sandhills Community College regarding a new Navigator program to help people having a hard time keeping a job. He said he was pleased to report that the program had enrolled over fifty Moore County citizens, with some taking classes and some being placed already in good paying jobs. He said it was a very positive program for County citizens. Commissioner Graham, a member of the Social Services Board of Directors, noted that the program was being offered in conjunction with DSS and that Moore County was a pilot program.

## **CLOSED SESSION**

Upon motion made by Commissioner Graham, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to enter into closed session pursuant to N.C.G.S. 143-318.11 (a)(3), to discuss Walker Station, et al vs. Moore County, and (a)(6).

The Board reported no action upon returning to open session at 11:29am.

## **ADDITIONAL AGENDA – NEW BUSINESS**

Chairman Quis noted an additional agenda item that had come to the attention of the Board from Moore County Schools. Upon motion made by Commissioner Graham, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to add this item for the Schools to the agenda as New Business Item B.


### Moore County Schools Request Regarding Bids for the New Southern Pines Elementary School


Mr. John Birath, Executive Director for Operations for Moore County Schools, informed the commissioners that bids had been received for the new Southern Pines elementary school. The available funds were \$27,360,554, but the lowest bid was at approximately \$29.9 million and the second lowest bid was at approximately \$30.988 million. School officials had immediately reached out to the apparent low bidder and value engineered to reduce costs. However, the contractor had called the evening before and provided official notice at 9:30am this day that he was withdrawing his bid due to a mathematical error. School officials looked to the next lowest bidder and applying the same value engineering applied with the first bidder the net difference in available funds and cost would be \$2.68 million. Mr. Birath shared that the contractor had another bid due at noon this day and did not want to submit that bid only to withdraw it if being awarded the Moore County bid. The contractor could not take on both projects. Mr. Birath explained that rebidding would take several weeks, thus delaying project completion and increasing costs. He reviewed that funding included for furniture, fixtures, and equipment (FF&E) could be applied to the \$2.68 million and the County could consider other options to fund FF&E later since those items would not be needed immediately. Chairman Quis inquired regarding the deadline for a decision and Mr. Birath said the contractor had to know by noon this day. Chairman Quis noted that everyone was relying on truthfulness and Moore County Schools Superintendent Dr. Robert Grimesey concurred and said Schools officials were laying out to the commissioners everything they knew. Mr. Birath shared that the contractor had previously completed work for the Schools and the history had been good. Commissioner Graham inquired regarding the cost difference between the second and third lowest bidders and Mr. Birath indicated it was about \$500,000. Commissioner Daeke asked Mr. Birath his thoughts on the best option. Mr. Birath said he would proceed to the school would be ready to open in August 2020. Dr. Grimesey said this was unprecedented and suggested proceeding. He said the Board of Education Chair was the only member of that board who was aware he was even standing before the commissioners (because the situation had evolved so quickly). He said they could not do better if they re-bid as everyone would know the floor so the cost would not get lower, and there was also inflation to consider. Additionally, it would push the project completion date well into the school year. He discussed that the bond issuance would cover the face value of the bid and then consideration could be given to a strategy to cover the FF&E expenses. Chairman Quis asked if the County would be in any jeopardy with bond rating agencies. County Manager Wayne Vest reviewed that there was authorization for \$103 million and the answer to the question was no because the County would not get outside what the voters allowed to be committed. Commissioner Graham asked about the possibility of potential State bond funds being applied and Mr. Vest indicated it was possible though he was not sure yet what would qualify if that bond issue moved forward. Commissioner Graham said it gave her pause that the voters said \$103 million and they kept stacking on to that amount. She asked if it was possible to negotiate FF&E and she charged school officials with making up the \$2.68 million somehow. Commissioner Gregory asked about the value of the land where the current schools were located and the possibility of its sale offsetting additional expenses. Dr. Grimesey said the values varied and indicated this could be a potential

source of reimbursement, but there would need to be updated appraisals. Commissioner Gregory asked what the last appraisal amount was and Dr. Grimesey declined to share that information publicly so as to maintain competitive posturing for eventual sale. There was further discussion and Dr. Grimesey said he was satisfied with the value engineering thus far, they were in a position that they could proceed with the building, and the F&E could be reconciled another day. He also reviewed the priorities for the new schools being built and noted the potential of impacts to the Pinehurst project. Chairman Quis said the commissioners understood what they were facing. Commissioner Graham asked about extending the time to notify and contractor and Mr. Birath indicated that was not an option. Chairman Quis discussed the funds that may be realized from the sale of the old schools going back to the County and not the school system. It was explained that the funds would have to go back to the Schools but would be available for capital needs. Commissioner Graham noted that how those funds were spent was ultimately at the Schools' discretion. Mr. Vest explained that through the power of its purse strings, the County could have input and involvement. Dr. Grimesey concurred with that statement. Brief discussion followed. Upon motion made by Commissioner Daeke, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to approve the additional funding of \$2.68 million going with the second lowest responsive, responsible bidder since the first lowest responsive, responsible bidder withdrew, and agree to fund that difference. Dr. Grimesey indicated Schools officials would be back in touch moving forward from this decision.

### ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, upon motion made by Commissioner Graham, seconded by Commissioner Ritter, the Board voted 5-0 to adjourn the March 5, 2019, regular meeting of the Moore County Board of Commissioners at 11:58am.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners, County of Moore, North Carolina, that pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the North Carolina General Statutes, the following project ordinance is hereby adopted:

Section 1. The projects authorized are the pump station 3-3 replacement, pump station MR-1 elimination, pump station 3-1 replacement, SCADA improvements and water and sewer line extensions.

Section 2. The officers of this unit are hereby directed to proceed with the project within the term of the budget contained herein.
