
Quarterly Service Awards

Committees Update



The Utilities Task Force (Commissioners Ritter and Daeke) met at Public Works on January 25 and spent most of their time in discussion of water service extensions. They also received updates regarding wellhead protection, surplus properties, and a capacity fee/rate study. Some of the issues are planned to be discussed with the full Board during the second regular meeting in February.

The Moore County Transportation Committee (MCTC), chaired by Commissioner Daeke, also met January 25 and drew a standing room only crowd at the Ag Center with many citizens interested in the discussion of a proposed Western Connector.



The Courthouse Facilities Advisory Committee, chaired by Commissioner Catherine Graham, met January 31 at the Rick Rhyne Public Safety Center. The Committee began discussion of programming for a new court facility and will coordinate tours of courthouses in other counties before convening again in a few weeks. Commissioner Daeke also serves on this committee.
