Work Session Recap



The commissioners met for a day-long work session on the 8th of this month, covering a number of issues from capital projects to ordinance revisions. Several of the items discussed have been moved forward for action, including the potential refunding of the County's 2010 Limited Obligation Bonds and USDA East Moore Water District loans 2003, 2008A, and 2008B. The potential savings from an early refunding of the LOBs and restructuring of the EMWD loans is currently estimated at over \$3.5 million through 6/30/2048. A public hearing regarding this opportunity has been scheduled for October 4th at 5:30 p.m.

Property Sale will Benefit Parks and Rec.

During the September 20th regular meeting, the Board of Commissioners accepted an offer of \$350,000 for the County's "Bengston Property" in Eagle Springs. This property was willed to the County by a former resident, Peter Bengston, for the benefit of the Parks and Recreation Department, where the proceeds from the sale will be allocated.

Quarterly Service Awards



The commissioners honored County employees receiving length of service awards this quarter at a luncheon on September 13th. Those awarded represented a combined 255 years of service to Moore County citizens.

Legislative Goals Adopted

The Board this month adopted the following legislative goals to submit to the NC Association of County Commissioners: 1) the restoration of lottery funds for schools capital projects, 2) a revision of the State's teacher funding formula, and 3) the elimination of the State's tier ranking system of counties. The goals will now be considered amongst those submitted by other counties and voted on in January as the NCACC prioritizes what it will advocate for on behalf of counties in the next long session of the General Assembly.
