

## **DESCRIPTION OF CONTENT FOR CLE/CPE**

### **Cyber Security for Layers: Protecting Client Information & Securing Your Operations**

*Professor Shannon Tufts, Associate Professor of Public Law and Government and Director, Center for Public Technology, UNC School of Government* (1.5 hours)

Cybersecurity attacks are at an all-time high, with daily threats of phishing attempts, data harvesting, and malware downloads. Understanding how to identify and prevent such attacks, which target your enterprise data, your confidential client data, as well as your personal and professional data, is paramount for lawyers. This session will provide requisite education on the topic of essential cybersecurity strategies and approaches for lawyers. Attendees will learn to identify potential attacks or attempts to compromise organizational systems, how to mitigate those potential attacks, and the various breaches that have occurred across the state impacting organizations at every level. The goal of the session is to ensure lawyers are able to improve their detection and defenses against breaches, while protecting confidential client data, as part of their daily law practice operations. **(This session will also include one-half hour of Ethics credit.)**

### **Crossing the Line: Sexual Harassment in the Workplace**

This course will review the current state of the law related to sexual harassment and provide best practices for how employers can avoid and respond to these complaints.

Objectives:

1. To make the audience aware of recent increase in sexual harassment allegations in response to the #metoo movement.
2. To educate the audience on what to expect from the EEOC given the recent cultural shift.
3. To provide employers with ways to get ahead of the curve by considering revised employment policies and procedures.

### **Elder Abuse - Connections**

Many different government agencies have legal authority to protect elders from abuse and exploitation. This session will explore how the authority of county social services agencies overlaps and connects with that of others, including law enforcement, clerks of court, and state agencies. We will also review the laws governing information sharing between these agencies.

### **Hemp Law: A Budding Industry**

Hear how recent changes to state and federal laws, rules, and regulations are opening doors for the hemp industry. What criminal issues remain? What ethical and professional responsibility issues must lawyers consider before and during their representation of hemp-related clients? This program will provide a general primer of the industry for lawyers interested in the practice.
